Islanders row clear of Clounmacon

The second half followed in the same vein and all the home sides subs were given a chance to show their worth. The final score was Valentia 2 - 22 to Clounmacon 0 - 07.

All the Valentia players played well on the night and best for Clounmacon were Kieran O'Mahony, Brian Carty and John O'Carroll.

The visitors enjoyed their trip to Valentia and an entertaining evening was had by all at the Ring Lyne after the game.

LAUNE RANGERS B 4 - 18 KNOCKNAGOSHEL 1 - 9 In this game in Killorglin on Saturday it was the visitors who started well and had three points on the board after six minutes.

However, Laune Rangers took control and did not allow Knocknagoshel any further scores in this half.

The home side rattled over nine unanswered points to take a six point lead into the interval with Colm O'Shea at full forward pulling the strings.

Rangers continued their dominance after the break and a fifth minute goal saw them lead 1 - 12 to 0 - 3 after five minutes. test with the free-taking skills of the home side's Seán O'Connell and Ballydonoghue's Tommy Kennelly a feature of the game. The home side led 0 - 5 to 0 - 2 at the break with O'Connell kicking four from frees and play with the other score coming from Johnny Daughton. Tommy Kennelly and Pádraig Bunyan had pointed frees for the visitors.

Ballydonoghue started the second half well and three points from the boot of Kennelly had the sides level.

St Senans hit back and took the lead once more but the game was level at 0 - 7 each entering the last ten minutes. However, St Senans finished stronger with points from substitute Darragh Kennelly and O'Connell securing victory for the League pacemakers.
