LAUNE Rangers are the Larkins Bakery Mid Kerry Junior Football Champions for 2010. In the final played in Beaufort on last Tuesday a significant burst of scoring just before half-time laid the foundation for what was in the end a comfortable victory.

Glenbeigh / Glencar aided by the breeze in the first half started brightly with two early points from centre half forward Bernard Murphy before Colm O'Shea opened Rangers account with a point in the 10th minute. A Murphy point from a free was cancelled out by an Ian Costelloe point for Rangers.

Two further points from the outstanding Murphy in the 16th and 18th minutes put Glenbeigh / Glencar three points clear (0-5 to 0-2) but then Rangers upped their game. Colm O'Shea pointed a free in the 24th minute and this was quickly followed by points from Eamon Carey, Shane O'Connor and O'Shea again to edge Rangers a point in front.

Veteran full-forward Adrian Hassett was causing a lot of problems for the Glenbeigh / Glencar defence. Carey then struck for a crucial goal just before half-time to give Rangers a four point advantage. Bernard Murphy closed the first half scoring with a point from a free to leave the score at

The second half was only two minutes old when wing back David Coffey scored a great individual goal for Rangers and thereafter Glenbeigh/Glencar were playing catch up. Murphy and Colm O'Shea swapped points before further points from Murphy and Connie Murphy saw Glenbeigh / Glencar narrow the gap to four points entering the final quarter of the match.

But then Rangers hit three unanswered points between the 48th and 58th minutes from Mark Healy, Colm O'Shea and Eamon Carey to stretch their advantage to seven points. Stephen O'Sullivan's goal in the final minute came too late for Glenbeigh/Glencar.

After the match Mid Kerry Board Chairman James Doyle presented the winners Shield to joint Laune Rangers captains Eamon Carey and Gary Flynn and the man of the match award sponsored by Larkins Bakery was presented to Bernard Murphy of Glenbeigh/Glencar.

The centrepiece for the day will be the inaugural Dr Bill Mangan Juvenile Hurling Tournament. South Kerry Hurling Coiste na nOg are delighted and honoured to respond to the invitation from the Trustees of Muckross House to organise an under ten (U 10) hurling tournament to

perpetuate the memory of the late Dr Bill Mangan. Dr. Bill, as he was affectionately known, was a Trustee and former Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Muckross House. In the early 1990s he spearheaded the development of the Muckross Traditional Farms, which is now one of the "must see" visitor attraction sites in the

South West of Ireland. The juvenile hurling tournament will, it is hoped, be a very appropriate way to honour a true friend of Muckross - who would be delighted to see the youngsters of Kerry connecting with their heritage on the green pastures of the Muckross Traditional Farms.
